5th Annual Youth Fishing Derby

This year's Youth Fishing Derby will occur on July 14th at the Bay Street Ponds from 8:00 AM until 1:00 PM. Generally, we have 110 – 120 youth plus many parents. In addition to fishing, we have a variety of interesting exhibits and activities including Metal Detecting, Police Dog Demonstration, Exotic Animals, the Phillips Aquatic Bus, Face Painting. We serve hot dogs and chips for lunch and Rita's Ices magically appears. Trophies for the most fish and the largest fish are awarded for 3 different age groups and "goodie bags" are distributed to all participants.

Putting together this event takes a lot of preparation work by a team of dedicated Elk volunteers and an even greater number of supporting staff on event day. – We want to invite you to become a member of our team and help us plan and conduct the Derby. This event needs to reflect positively on our Lodge and demonstrate that Elks are committed to community service.

We need Elks, and fishing friends, to help with the following activities:

- Soliciting donations of dollars, goods, and services to augment our ENF grant
- Logistical support to move equipment from/to the Lodge for use at Bay Street Ponds
- Fishing support persons to set-up 4 Field Stations, then measure and record fish caught
- Acquisition, packaging, and distribution of "goodie bags" and raffle items to participants
- Prepare and install directional and informational signs at the Derby
- Install advertising banners at 3 locations and have local merchants display posters
- Assist with the online attendee registration processing, pre-event sign-in materials, and event day sign-in activities
- Readying rods & reels for use, transporting to/from the Ponds, distributing to participants, collecting and returning to storage
- Preparing, delivering, and serving lunch to participants, parents, and staff
- And, a multitude of minutia that is essential to a successful event.

Veterans Committee

VA Expands Telehealth

On May 11th the VA announced a new federal rule that will allow VA doctors, nurses and other healthcare providers to administer care to Veterans using telehealth regardless of where in the US the provider or Veteran is located, including when care will occur across state lines or outside a VA facility.

Previously, it was unclear whether VA providers could furnish care to Veterans in other states through telehealth because of licensing restrictions or state-specific telehealth laws. This new rule exercises federal preemption to override those state restrictions, paving the way for VA to expand care to Veterans using telehealth.

By enabling Veterans nationwide to receive care at home, the rule will especially benefit Veterans living in rural areas who would otherwise need to travel a considerable distance or across state lines to receive care. The rule also expands Veterans access to critical care that can be provided virtually – such as mental health care and suicide prevention by allowing quicker and easier access to VA mental health providers through telehealth.






